1.1 Background Of Study

Nora stays in *The Midnight Library* with the person who helped her navigate it as a result.

Since Nora Seed was the main character and the subject of numerous plot arcs, the work focuses primarily on her mental illnesses. The phrase "She got some water and swallowed two anti-depressants" (Haig, 20) indicated that Nora suffered from depression. The plotline of the plot represented Nora's mental illness since she had to consider the option of starting over in a new life. Along with Matt Haig, the writer also wants to describe the symptoms of depression and how she suffered the depression. Then, each symptom has a classification (Beck & Alford, 2009).
