In this study, the writer discusses the Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) experienced by Anna Fox in the novel The Woman in The Window by A.J. Finn. The primary purpose of this study is to find out the causes and analyze the impact that occurs by finding the symptoms experienced by Anna Fox.

The writer develops a theoretical framework by discussing theories and approaches to solve the problem structurally. The writer applies PTSD theory to analyze the behavior data and character condition. The psychological approach is used in this research. The issues discussed in this study are limited to examining the novel's structure, which is focused on research covering themes, settings, and characters. This study focuses on the causes, symptoms, and impacts of PTSD on the main character as literary criticism. In addition, this analysis uses a qualitative descriptive method to describe the problem using words.

From this research, three findings can be clarified as problem formulation.
