1.1 Background of Research

According to Wagstaff (1999) WordWall is a learning media that must be used, not just displayed or viewed. This media can be designed to increase learning group activities and can also actively involve students in its creation. WordWall can be accessed via a computer, tablet or smartphone, making it easily accessible and convenient for students. WordWall is also an online platform that is widely used by teachers to help their students in learning, the features in this platform make it easier for teachers to provide practice questions to students, this platform is very suitable for use in teaching task based learning methods.

In carrying out the teaching process, of course as teachers we need to apply learning techniques that are suitable for teaching students, one of the teaching techniques that is suitable for teaching reading is Task-Based Language Teaching (TBLT) . Task-Based Language Teaching (TBLT) is a language learning method that places

practical tasks and activities as the main focus in learning. TBLT is a teaching method language using tasks as the core unit for planning and compiling instructional materials in language teaching (Richards & Rodgers, 2001). In TBLT, students learn language by completing tasks related to their daily situations and needs.
