# CHAPTER ONE INTRODUCTION

#### **1.1 Background of Study**

A literary work can both impart and receive social impact (Klarer, 2003), since it comes from several cultural contexts in society. Literary works arise from the thoughts and experiences of an author while living life, facing problems, and living values; as being tools to convey author's feeling (Kardiansyah and Salam, 2021). Literature conveys a meaning or idea through its text's purpose, message, and content (Carter, 2007). By this, the writer uses literature as a tool that contains ideas for works of art (Puspita & Pranoto, 2021).

In literary education, literary competence lies in an important position as it reflects students' critical thinking ability to understand the text as a whole and connect it to both of their experience and social phenomena (Suprayogi, Samanik, and Novanti, 2021). In this context, psychology studies various mental aspects and processes of the human mind that include consciousness and subjective experience. Freud argued that a person's behavior is not caused by just one desire, but by many desires. Some desires may go unconscious, but they still affect how we take action. The three parts of desire are desire id, ego, superego. Freud states that inner conflict arises as a result of the opposition between the three main personality structures of the id, ego, and superego.

In this context, conflict can arise from a variety of sources, including differences in needs, values, goals, or interests between individuals, groups, or even countries. One of the causes of inner conflict is the disagreement between the needs and internal values of individuals. This kind of conflict can lead to feelings of confusion, stress, or even feelings of guilt.

In addition, past traumatic experiences can also be a cause of inner conflict. Psychological trauma such as abuse, significant loss, or other traumatic experiences can cause an internal conflict between the desire to forget the past and the need to understand and process the experience. When a person struggles to cope with past trauma, an internal conflict can arise between the desire to protect oneself from pain and the need to face it for the healing process. Social pressure can also trigger inner conflict. Standards imported by society or the environment can conflict with individual values and desires, causing a conflict between the need to conform and the desire to stay true to personal values. For example, pressure to meet parental or societal expectations can conflict with one's personal dreams or desires, creating significant internal tension.

Inner conflict causes psychology disorder. This conflict is generally experienced by every individual. When a person is faced with a choice between two or more conflicting goals, this inner conflict problem arises. In such situations, individuals have to make difficult decisions because they cannot fulfill all objectives simultaneously (Masyhur.*et al*, 2023).

*My Heart and Other Black Holes,* a novel written by Jasmine Warga, tells the story of a character named Aysel as a teenager who experienced deep sadness and was no longer interested in what she was doing in her life. She is obsessed with death and has plans to commit suicide. Through a suicide partner finding website she meets Roman, a teenage boy with deep past wounds. At the first they don't have much in common, Aysel and Roman begin to fill the void in each other's lives. As their relationship grew stronger, Aysel began to doubt their choice to commit suicide together. They must find a way to find new meaning in their lives, and Aysel must choose between continuing to hope or choosing to free herself from the darkness that squashes her.

This novel was chosen for several reasons. The story in this novel focuses on Aysel's character who experiences psychological conflict like when he commits suicide but fears the consequences. To understand how internal conflicts can affect a person's life It is very important to understand and analyze literary works like this. Therefore, from here the author raises the study of inner conflicts that affect the main characters depicted in the novel. It means this research will discuss in depth about the inner conflict that exists in Aysel's character. For this reason, a psychological approach was chosen to analyze this issue. Kurt Lewin's (1997) theory of inner conflict would support the existing analysis.
